## **Working with our donors, for the community**

**E**cology Action developed a Web site for the community to more easily find environmental organizations; the **Jazz Society of Santa Cruz County** worked to archive written histories and recordings of local jazz musicians; **Communities Organized for Relational Power in Action** provided civic engagement training to Latino immigrants in the Pajaro Valley and increased parent involvement in children's academics in Live Oak, and **Dientes** continued to offer low-cost dental care to those in need.

**These are just some of the work supported by one of several hundred grants totaling \$5,257,443 awarded from more than 300 funds at the Community Foundation of Santa Cruz County in 2007.**

*The Foundation is essentially a collection of giving accounts, or "funds," each one with a charitable purpose tailored to the interests of its founding donor. In 2007, the Foundation received hundreds of gifts, each earmarked by its donor for a specific fund.*

*Some funds are permanently endowed and invested for long-term growth, with only a part of their earnings made available for grants. Other funds are fully expendable.*

*Through grants from these funds, the Foundation links community programs and services to donors who support them. Last year, two-thirds of the Foundation's grants came from donor advised funds, which allow the donor to make recommendations for grants to the Foundation's Board. The remaining grants came from earnings on permanent endowed funds or from private foundations that provide the Foundation with funding for targeted needs.*

*The grantmaking total for 2007 is more than 20% over 2006. The increase in our grant numbers is directly related to the confidence of all our donors, be they individuals, families, corporations, or private foundations. The Foundation has extensive knowledge of the community and the organizations that serve it. We offer personalized giving services and professional investment expertise. These strengths make the Foundation a valued partner for local people who want to make a difference.*

# 2007 Grants

In 2007, the Community Foundation of Santa Cruz County awarded more than \$5.2 million in grants to organizations in six broad fields of interest: Arts, History, and Culture; Community Development; Education/ Youth Development; Environment; Health; and Human Services. Within each of these fields of interest, grants are listed in one of two ways: 1) as discretionary grants, or 2) as donor advised grants. In some cases, individuals with donor advised funds have elected to partner with the Foundation in supporting competitive grant requests; these grants are identified with parenthetical notations.

**Discretionary grants** are made through a competitive application process, reviewed by the Program Committee, and then approved by the Foundation Board. Scholarships are discretionary grants with a separate application process. Discretionary grants support organizations serving Santa Cruz County.

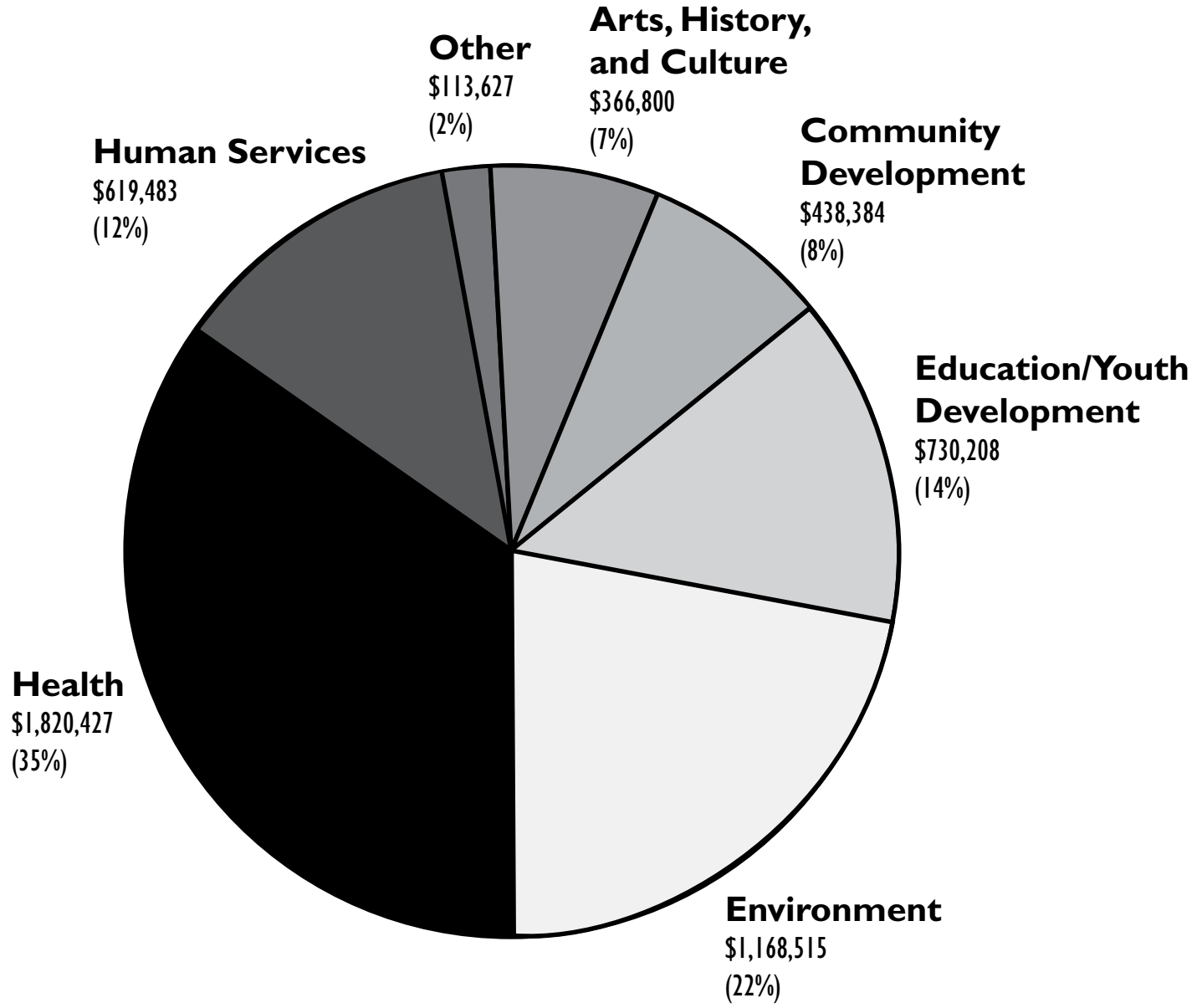
**Donor advised grants**, made at the recommendation of individuals with donor advised funds at the Foundation, may support local, state, nation and international projects. Nearly half of the total amount awarded from donor advised funds went to organizations in Santa Cruz County. Recommendations for donor advised grants are reviewed by staff and approved by the Foundation Board.

The grants list for 2007 includes distributions to local nonprofits from funds established for their benefit at the Foundation (**designated agency disbursements**) and support through **philanthropic partnerships** to major community initiatives such as Healthy Kids of Santa Cruz County (to provide health insurance to children from low and middle income families).

#### **KUSP-FM \$14,000**

a two-year grant to record, promote and rebroadcast high quality live, local musical performances for a wider audience

#### **Kuumbwa Jazz Center \$15,000**

a two-year grant to support jazz education programs for youth and to launch new outreach efforts for school-aged youth in Live Oak and the Pajaro Valley *(partially supported by donor advised funds)*
